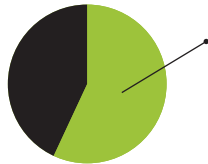


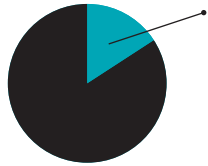


FANS Study

The Female Asian Never Smoker Study



57% of Asian American females diagnosed with lung cancer have never smoked.



While 16% of all females diagnosed with lung cancer have never smoked.

FANS is a study of lung cancer in Asian females who have never smoked.

FANS will look at secondhand smoke, genetics, cultural factors, and other possible causes.

Who can join?

Asian females living in the greater Bay Area (including mixed Asian/other), aged 21–90, who have never smoked

We are looking for two groups:

- Females **recently diagnosed** (January 1, 2020 to present) with lung cancer
- Females **never diagnosed** with any type of cancer

Joining is voluntary, and your information will be kept confidential.

What is involved?

- **Completing 45-minute survey** online, by phone, or by mail (\$25 gift card)
- **Providing a saliva sample** (\$25 gift card)
- **Access to stored tumor tissue** (\$25 gift card, for lung cancer patients only)
